November Program: Using Flannels and Plaids In Our Appliqué

Ladies, it goes without saying—We Feather Princesses absolutely LOVE our fabrics. We will buy fabrics at any quilt shop and at any time. Sometimes we select specific colors for a particular appliqué project; while at other times the color or the texture of the fabrics do not matter. We just adore fabrics, we hoard them, and we use them to create our most challenging, fun, and impressive appliqué quilts. Cottons, batiks, flannel, fleece, and wool are all on our fabric radar when it comes to appliqué—we can use them all. And now that we are knee-deep into Fall and cooler temperatures are here, flannel quilts will take center stage. Before long we all will wrap up in our flannel quilts and cozy up in front of the fireplace. So let's think about flannel quilts for a few minutes and how we use flannel and plaids fabrics in our quilting this time of year.

I will start by saying that "we have come a long way, baby" in making flannel quilts. Do you remember the old flannel quilts from 15 or 20 years ago, where we stacked layers of fabrics, sewed them, and then cut them around the edge to get a ragged effect? Oh my goodness, what a chore that was! But you know what, quilting with flannels has changed over the years; the quality of flannel fabrics has significantly improved, and now we use it for appliqué as well as patchwork. Striking appliqué quilts are now made from flannels and plaids, using cottons and wools as their counterparts. At our guild meeting this coming Wednesday, as we explore the topic of using flannel and plaids in our appliqué quilts, let's think on these points and be ready to discuss them during our program:

- The durability of flannel and its shrinking and pillage
- To wash or not to wash flannel
- How to prepare flannel for appliqué (use starch or not)
- Using flannel for a background or for appliqué pieces
- How to tear or cut flannel and plaid fabrics to prevent stretching or distortion
- Pinning and pressing flannel fabrics - to steam or not to steam
- Appliquing cotton fabrics on flannel
- Appliquing wool fabrics on flannel
- Tools to use when cutting/stitching flannel
- Seam allowance to use when stitching flannel
- Batting to use when making flannel quilts
- How to quilt appliqué quilts made from flannel

Also, we will look at actual samples of appliqué on flannel and plaid fabrics. So if you have quilts made from flannel or plaid fabrics, be sure to bring them for us to see.

At our November guild meeting, cotton fabrics will take a back seat as we focus on flannels and plaids in our appliqué. Let's be inspired and motivated to use these fabrics (especially in our seasonal appliqué projects), as we broaden our knowledge and enhance our skills using different kinds of fabrics when we appliqué.

I'm looking forward to exploring this exciting topic with you during our informative program.

The Challenge quilts will be a spectacular addition to our amazing Quilt Show, so make sure that your beautiful and unique Challenge quilt is a part of it!
