

Margaret will further explain and clarify the difference between appliqué and reverse appliqué, discuss the pros of using reverse appliqué, and share with us the steps to stitch reverse appliqué. Also Margaret will present an amazing trunk show of her stunning appliqué quilts.

Margaret Willingham is an experienced teacher who specializes in teaching her signature, non-traditional method for hand and machine reverse appliqué, that makes it easy and FUN! Her Eye of the Beholder's



method is called "Trace, Baste, Snip & Stitch."

Margaret's 10 years of teaching quilting is anchored in 40 years of training dancers of all ages and skill levels. She has taught her hand and machine reverse appliqué methods to quilters nationally at Road to California, Vermont Quilt Festival, American Quilter's Society Quilt Shows, Kansas City Regional Quilt Festival, Appliqué Away on Galveston Bay, Academy of Appliqué, and QuiltFest. Quilting is a journey and Margaret will inspire our applique adventures to be taken creatively and joyfully with grace.

Her patterns and articles have been published in Fons & Porter's Magazine, 100 Quilt Blocks, American Quilter Magazine, and On Point; and she co-authored "Christmas RAPPing" with Nan Baker. Her patterns have a distinctive style, and she designs patterns for Banyan Batiks, Island Batik, Batik Textiles, Turtle Hand Batik, Cherrywood Fabrics, RJR, and Timeless Treasures.

Margaret is inspired with creating things of beauty and helping others find their creative voice, while gaining the skills to make beautiful things. She grew up with a legacy of family heirlooms. Antiques passed down with love and history were relished and used. Among the furniture, china and silver was the hand work of her ancestors: lovely linens and quilts hand-stitched with decorative threads to grace a table or a bed.

Many of Margaret's designs were inspired by the craftsman's work of the Victorian Era. The Victorians had an eye for beauty, and enhanced their works with graceful scrolls and swirls, adding a touch of elegance to their lives. Margaret loves that touch of elegance and believes that quilting gives us the

chance to decorate the lives of those we love with a touch of elegance, whether in a wall-hanging, a table runner or a bed-sized quilt. She sees design possibilities all around her—on book covers, sidewalk grates, railings and even tire rims.

As Margaret creates pattern designs, she plays with pattern, color and texture, making something beautiful to enliven her world and express love to those around her. And she is most at peace when she is creating.

For our inspirational lecture/trunk show, Margaret will present "Reverse Appliqué: Revealing Beauty – What is reverse appliqué?" She will explain the difference between appliqué and reverse appliqué? And she will tell us "When was it developed and by whom?" Also, she will tell "How to quilt reverse appliqué—and what is hidden will be revealed!" And she will show us some of her stunning appliqué quilts, incorporating this appliqué technique.

So, plan to join us this coming Wednesday at our April 12 guild meeting to see Margaret's quilts and to listen to her informative lecture on "Reverse Appliqué." I guarantee you will be inspired to try this fun technique, for sure!

# We All Love a Good Mystery

Fabric requirements are given at the onset and generally include details about colors of the fabrics, as well as the fabric quantity. There are even mystery quilts that not only are a surprise when they are finally assembled, but the quilt makers also resolve a mystery story from clues that are given along the way.

A good mystery is entertaining, for sure. But when it comes to our phenomenal quilt circles, there is no mystery. There is no guessing, twists, turns, or puzzles. When we meet with our dynamic leaders, Princesses Becky, Shirley, Cheryl, Karen, and Cathleene, at the very beginning of each circle, we already know the end of the story. We know that astounding camaraderie and fabulous fellowship will abound. We know that inspiration will peak at it highest as we share valuable hints, techniques, and tips with each other. We know that assistance is guaranteed and that "help" will always be readily
