## June Program: Collage Quilts -Making One Quilt from Many by Joanne Rodriguez and Maria Nunez

A collage is a picture in which various materials or objects (paper, cloth, photographs, etc.) are fused or glued onto a larger surface. And because we quilters all love fabrics, it's all about thinking freely and painting with fabrics, to create gorgeous collage quilts. The fabrics can be bits or scraps in any color, pattern, or size; and when placed together in layers with other fabrics, they come together to create the design as the overall collage evolves.

At our June program, we will take a look at collage quilts and how to make them. We will try NEW things and learn to be free thinkers! Our talented member, Princess Maria Nunez, will lead us on a fabulous applique fabric journey and show us how she makes her stunning and unique collage quilts. As an intro, Maria usually thinks of a theme and then she chooses a couple of different fabrics within that theme, using the same colorway and fabric texture. And she then simply cuts the fabrics and begins to build the design.

Also, during the inspirational program Maria will share relevant hints and tips for creating impressive and attractive collage quilts:

- Sewing/quilting supplies needed to make a fabric collage quilt
- Process for making the fabric collage quilt
  - deciding on the subject or pattern
  - auditioning and selecting the fabrics
  - cutting and placing the fabrics
  - gluing the fabrics
  - finishing the collage by adding blocks, borders, etc.
  - securing the layers and quilting the collage.

Maria will not only tell of her personal travels through the fantastic world of fabrics and how to put them together using appliqué, but she will also razzle and dazzle us with her fabulous collage quilt samples. So come one, come all to hear Maria's spectacular presentation about her phenomenal creative process of making exquisite collage quilts.



Here in our appliqué guild, if you would like to take a quiet balloon ride to relax and chill-out, consider stitching a hot air balloon—a colorful fabric hot air balloon, that is! The design consists of a hot air balloon flying through the clouds, with a gondola (basket) suspended beneath, adorned with seasonal flowers, leaves, and vines. And flying close to the balloon is a gorgeous bird, chirping and singing a happy tune coming straight from it's heart!

evil or misfortune. Until recently, they have taken on the role similar to the American Santa. In Norway, they are called "Nisse."

We distributed a **Christmas Gnome Special Block** kit, "**Chilling' With My Gnomies**" to most of you at our 2022 Christmas Luncheon. And we hope you are learning and having fun as you create your special block. If you have already finished your adorable **Christmas Gnome Special Block**, we congratulate you! If you have not started creating your block, then we lovingly suggest that you take out your **Christmas Gnome Special Block** kit now, design and appliqué your "**Chilling' With My Gnomies**" block, and bring it to our upcoming Christmas in July Celebration, convening at our July 12 guild meeting.

#### Please remember:

- If you did not receive a kit last December, but you want to make a block, please see me, Princess Joanne Rodriguez, and I will give a kit for you.
- If you received a kit and now prefer not to make the block, please return the kit to me, so we can share it with another lovely Princess who wants to make the block.
- As you create your block, please follow the easy applique instructions included in the kit.

Also please use the following supplies contained in the kit:

- White and silver snowflake (13" x 13") background fabric square.
- The background fabric square measures 13" x 13", allowing enough fabric for a generous seam allowance, resulting in a 12½" x 12½" square block. (12" inches for the appliqué design, plus ½" seam allowance on each side of the block, to be trimmed by the winner.)

 Black Christmas Gnome fabric, red/black check fabric, and green/black check fabric.

### Also, remember:

- When you finish appliquéing your block, save your left-over fabric scraps, to share with other Princesses who want to make a block, and/or to share the scraps with the winners of the blocks to use to finish their quilts, if they desire.
- To turn in your completed block and fabric scraps to me at our monthly guild meetings, now through July 2023. You must turn in your completed block by July 12, to be eligible for the drawing.
- At our Feather Princesses July 12, 2023 guild meeting:
  - The drawing to win the blocks will be held at our "Christmas in July" Celebration.
  - We will display all of the completed blocks turned in, vote, and award a prize to the maker of the block that receives the most votes for the "Most Unique Appliqué Design."
