As kids of yesteryear and adults today, one staple item in our toybox was and continues to be a box of Crayola Crayons. Now that coloring and coloring books have gained a resurgence in popularity, as a means of restoring calm, more adults own a box of crayons now than ever before. Whether the box contains 8, 16, 24, 32, or 64 pieces, the primary colors are guaranteed to be there. And since the introduction of Crayola drawing crayons by Binney & Smith back in 1903, more than 200 distinctive colors have been produced in a wide variety of assortments; but the colors red, yellow, and blue continue to take center stage. Also, since the introduction of fluorescent crayons in the 1970s, these standard colors have been complemented by a number of specialty crayon assortments as well.

Primary colors include red, yellow, and blue, and they cannot be mixed from other colors. They are the source of all other colors; and the common meaning of these primary colors are:

- Red Passion, Love, Anger
- Yellow Happiness, Hope, Deceit
- Blue Calm, Responsible, Sadness

September Program: "Live on the Edge"

So, you're creating a gorgeous quilt and you're as happy as a bee! You've appliquéd the quilt blocks and added the sashing—ta-da, and the quilt top is complete. At least you think so—until you stand back, look at it, and ponder—does it need a frame, should it have a border?

Borders provide a special touch to the overall design of a quilt, while providing a frame for a quilt, and also while providing an opportunity to easily enlarge a quilt. There are countless numbers of border designs out there—patchwork and appliqué; and usually the design of the border is determined or influenced by the design of the quilt top. A border can be a simple strip of fabric or it can be an intricately appliquéd addition with a totally different shape. At any rate, the border can be anything you want it to be. You, the quilter, are the boss!

At our September 13 quilt meeting, we will "live on the edge" and take a brief look at quilts with different kinds of appliquéd borders that are not straight, specifically scalloped and wavy borders; and we'll actually try our hands at stitching a simple wavy border. It will be a fun exercise and we hope you will participate with us. We will provide the fabrics and we ask you to bring the following basic supplies:

- Appliqué needles
- Thimble, if you use one
- Pins
- Appliqué thread in a neutral color
- Scissors for cutting, trimming, and clipping fabrics

After this hands-on demo, we hope you will have a broader perspective and outlook about quilt borders, especially borders with edges that are not straight.

Come, learn, and have fun with us this coming Wednesday, as we "live on the edge" and explore quilt borders that are not straight.

Healing Heart Blocks

Do you remember what your school colors were when you were in school years ago? If you do, do you remember what the colors represented and what they meant to you? School colors really are a



BIG DEAL and school colors are important, as they represent a number of things—academic achievement, a specific area of study, school pride, membership in an honors society... or they can just be pleasing colors to the soul! The bottom line is that there is no "right answer" to what each color represents.

At every age, school colors and mascots unify centers of education. Most schools choose a combination of colors to represent the student body which clearly differentiates them from their rivals and other schools. To set themselves apart, schools get creative with the colors that represent them.

School colors are often found in pairs and rarely no more than trios, though some professional teams use up to four colors in a set. Common colors include orange, purple, blue, red, and green. Primary colors are a big hit—blue, red, and yellow—as well as green, orange and purple; and these are often paired with a fairly neutral color (black, brown, gold, white, etc.)


Our Yearbook Committee Is On Its Way

Let's Celebrate National Jelly Roll Day

When we appliqué, we Feather Princesses use a plethora of shapes and sizes of fabrics to cut and stitch to our background squares. We adore fat eights, we love fat quarters, we cherish layer cakes, and we truly treasure our delightful jelly rolls. Each of these fabric



shapes have gained popularity in recent years; and each has its own place in our quilting stashes. But the jelly rolls are extremely popular right now, have taken center stage, and have earned a very special place in the quilting arena.

A quilting jelly roll is not a jam-filled cake; but rather it is a bundle of fabric strips $2\frac{1}{2}$ " wide by the width of the fabric (WOF), and they are usually cut from standard bolts measuring 44-45 inches. The name "Jelly Roll" was coined by Moda Fabrics to identify pre-cuts from its designer lines of quilting fabric; however, other fabric manufacturers have names for their bundles of strips, too:

- Island Batiks calls its strips "Island Strips"
- Hoffman Fabrics calls its strips "Bali Pops" and "Bali Poppy"
- Free Spirit Fabrics calls its strips a "Design Roll"
- Timeless Treasures calls its strips "Tonga Treat" and "Junior Tonga Treat"
- Riley Blake Designs calls its strips "Rolie Polies"

National Sew a Jelly Roll Day is celebrated on the third Saturday in September and this day encourages quilters to sew their jelly roll strips into lovely quilt projects. So take some time to select your colorful Jelly Roll, gather with your favorite Princess Pals on Saturday, September 16, celebrate National Jelly Roll Day, and have the very best time ever cutting and appliqueing different shapes from the $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips into beautiful works of art! See your applique quilts come to life, cutting and stitching fabric pieces from these $2\frac{1}{2}$ " strips of fabrics.
